

One Future uses an ecological approach to service planning and delivery, meaning that we look holistically at a person within their environment to ensure that any piece of work we complete is inclusive of the individual, their immediate networks and supports, the wider community, formal services, culture, risks, strengths, history and future.

We pride ourselves in delivering quality services in a timely manner and will respond creatively to individual and organisational need to ensure that people feel supported by our team from the initial contact. One Future shares the belief that supporting children and young people to achieve safety, wellbeing and positive life outcomes is central to the work of organisations that provide child protection and Out of Home Care services. We provide independent, quality assessments and carer reviews virtually and face to face, on behalf of agencies working with children and young people, carers, and birth families to support decision-making and permanency planning. We have both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal assessors available to undertake the following:

- Guardianship assessments
- Relative/kinship carer assessments
- Parenting capacity assessments
- Foster carer assessments
- Annual carer reviews
- 5-yearly carer reviews
- Complex assessments requiring an independent entity to address issues within placements, or placements at risk of breakdown.

And more customised assessments upon request.

Like all restorative practices, family group conferencing emerges from a history and philosophy of kinship and relationship as the central values of society found in many indigenous cultures. Family Group Conferencing (FGC) is a voluntary, inclusive and family-led approach to decision making. It involves family members coming together to make significant decisions and develop a family plan. FGC promotes respectful and strength-based engagement in planning to meet what is in the best interests of the child or young person, including their safety and wellbeing. We are an approved provider for Family group Conferencing with the Department of Communities and Justice and have qualified Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal facilitators who offer families a process that is safe and supportive, for important decisions to be made that are realistic and achievable.

We offer highly skilled and independent facilitators who aim to improve collaboration between families and services they are involved with and to ensure a coordinated, early response to pregnant women and their unborn babies. We facilitate three meetings with families and multidisciplinary agencies to support the development of a coordinated plan that is designed to keep babies safe and with their families and reduce the number of newborns being removed at birth. The 'Three Houses' tool is used to guide these meetings using a 'Signs of Safety' practice framework.

Our packages of support can be tailored to provide review meetings and practical and emotional engagement with families who are referred for a pregnancy family conference in the ante-natal and post-natal period.



Our goal with mentoring is to strengthen relationships and connection to community and to build a child or young person's confidence, resilience and positive self-image. We work closely with the child, young person, family/carer and referring agency to develop case plan goals and put in place strategies to meet identified needs. We believe that every young superhero has a story to tell and contribution to make. We help children and young people to make sense of their world, work through issues of loss and grief and take steps to make positive life choices. We have male and female mentors who identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and carefully match a child or young person to the most appropriate mentor.

We do this by having stringent recruitment practices, detailed policies and procedures and training, a zero-tolerance approach to breaches of our code of conduct and strong vision and values.
